August 2009 minutes approved

President: Phil Dahl – Deadline for player cards/member passes for all rec players is today. Many teams are still not in compliance. Much discussion followed on whether to allow games to continue. Result is that for U11 and up, player cards/member passes and Bonzi roster must be provided for the referee's review or the game must be forfeited. For U10 and below, we'll have to rely on the coaches to check each other's cards against their Bonzi roster. Remember the coaches need theirs too.

Vice President: Ryan Blonien, present, nothing major to report for the season other than a few yellow cards.

Secretary: POSITION OPEN, please ask clubs to look for volunteer.

Treasurer: Sarah Dahl – The following bill was presented and approved: Reimburse Phil Dahl for pizza and pop for the Sept. 19th meeting for all club presidents regarding the reorganization coming up. MSA to approve this bill and the treasurer's report as presented.

VP Operation: Gayle Paavola reports that most clubs have all of their player cards/member passes now, the only exception is that if the coaches do not have their RMA clearance current, the state will not release their player cards/member passes. Gayle congratulates all of the club registrars for their help in getting their teams ready so that the cards could be issued. She says that they all were so helpful! Also referees might need to know that the Oregon player cards/member passes do not require signatures, just a photo and laminated.

VP Development: Dennis Pelton – not present, no report.

MAR REP: Tom Hutchinson – not present, no report.

CLUBS:

Castle Rock: Shebanyah VanHoof reports that they have 247 registered players. This year they had so many at U6 and U7 that they did separate divisions for those two (both are still played co-ed). CR has some new board members, one is Dawn Schuller VP. This year the micro soccer is back on the

baseball outfields as a few years ago. Go around to the baseball area behind the high school and you will see signs for the fields.

Kalama: Not present – no report

Kelso: Josh Thompson reports that coaches have received their player cards/member passes and most have them ready to use.

Longview: Tony Werner (commissioner for LSC) reports that: 1) LSC is working on getting player cards, also referred to as member passes, in compliance with WSYSA. 2) Please send a parent or older sibling with your child when using the restrooms at 7th Ave. Park due to inappropriate activities seen taking place in them. 3) Due to recent thefts in unlocked vehicles in the parking lot, please remember to keep your car locked.

PLEASE NOTE: questions regarding hard casts: they **are** allowed in CYSA play because WSYSA now goes by FIFA/USSF rules regarding dangerous equipment. It is up to the referee whether to allow a cast or not, meaning that it is considered **not** dangerous. No padding is required nor a doctor's consent. Oregon rules do **not** allow casts in youth play.

Ocean Beach: Not present – no report.

Rainier/Clatskanie: Not present – no report.

CYSA VP Competition/Recreation: Brie Oestreich reports that she scheduled games for 189 rec teams. She reminds everyone that if a player hurts their head during a game or practice, they must have seen a doctor at an office visit for permission before being able to return to play.

VP Competition/Select: Meredith Ellis not present. Her report is that she and Brie have not yet been able to determine how much to reimburse select teams which did not play in the Portland Metro League as hoped. More on that to follow in October as the season progresses and we are able to determine costs to CYSA.

Timber Barons: Teresa Aloe not present. A question was raised concerning the new BU19 team which was formed late when a coach was found. No coach's application was ever brought before the board for approval, and it would be good to continue to follow the proper procedures. An email vote for the coach would be possible, as well as email questions regarding the process, if necessary.

District 5: Phil Dahl attended the September 13th meeting and they discussed trying to invite Portland-area teams to play in the D5 fall league instead of trying to join the Portland Metro League, which didn't prove to work out very well initially. Also mentioned were soccer academies that are used for year-around training facilities being established in Vancouver, some may end up replacing the ODP program.

Old Business: CYSA is still in need of a secretary, clubs are asked to look for a volunteer who can attend the next CYSA meeting. Harlan Crusier described the new schedule for tryouts for GU15+.

MSA to hold this season's tryouts on November 1st and 8th (two Sundays) from 2:00 – 4:00 at 7th Ave. Park.

New Business: Phil Dahl reports that club presidents and representatives met last Saturday September 19th to discuss the reorganization of the association and consolidation with the district. MSA to continue exploring these efforts.
